Construction Tips


- 1) Each piece should be removed from the frames with gentle pressure back and forth. You should not need a knife to cut pieces free.
- 2) Our inserts are designed to be glued together. We use Sobo craft glue, but any glue that is tacky and dries clear will work fine. Tacky glue assists with building as it holds better during construction. You can use painter's/masking tape for some joins, but glue is always best.
- 3) Keep some paper towels handy for cleanup during build.
- 4) Ensure you cleanup excess glue as you build. This is especially important in card lanes where dividers will be used or in spaces where a tray will be stored.
- 5) Check the build diagram included in the package for reference, including all parts, as well as build tips specific to this insert.
- 6) Always dry fit pieces first to ensure a good fit and to better understand how the kit goes together.
- 7) Allow your finished insert to dry overnight.
- 8) You can optionally sand and even stain your insert.








Building the Low Profile Small Character Tray (1x)

This single tray provides storage for your Forgotten Circles expansion character cards, character ability cards, character board, standee, mini, and tokens.

- 1) Lay base (A) down on your workspace in the orientation noted.
- 2) Next, place glue on the left end tab of inner wall (C) and connect to inner wall (B) and then place glue on the bottom of this structure and connect to base (A).
- 3) Next, place glue on the left end tab of inner wall (E) and connect to inner wall (D) and then place glue on the bottom of this structure and connect to base (A). Note that the rounded corners should face inward.
- 4) Next, place glue on the end tab of inner wall (B) and the bottom of outer wall (F) and connect.
- 5) Next, place glue on the end tab of inner wall (E), the bottom and side tabs of end wall (G), and connect.
- 6) Next, place glue on the end tab of inner wall (D) and the bottom of outer wall (H) and connect.
- 7) Next, place glue on the side tabs and bottom of end wall (\mathbf{I}) and connect.
- 8) Finally, after allowing 5 minutes to dry, place the tray lid on the tray.






Building the Forgotten Circles Monster Tray

This single small tray provides storage for Forgotton Circles monsters and your element discs.

BE CAREFUL PUNCHING THE SMALL HOLES OUT OF THESE PIECES AS THEY ARE SOMEWHAT FRAGILE UNTIL GLUED TOGETHER.

- 1) Lay base (N) down on your workspace in the orientation noted.
 2) Next, place glue on the bottom and side tabs of inner wall (O, highlighted in brown) and connect to base (N). Note the engraving
- position in the image. Repeat for inner wall (**P**, highlighted in brown). **3)** Next, place glue on the side tabs of divider wall (**R**, highlighted in purple) and connect. Repeat for the other two divider walls (**R**).
- **4)** Next, place glue on the bottom of outer wall (T) and connect. Repeat on the other side.
- 5) Next, place glue on the bottom and side tabs of outer wall (S) and connect. Note the engraving position on the image.
- **6)** Next, place glue on the bottom and side tabs of outer wall (**U**) and connect.




Plate #13 - Large character tray





Plate #14 - Monster stat sheet tray

Building the Small Character Trays (16x)


This group of 16 trays provides storage for each of your character cards, character ability cards, character boards, standees, minis, and tokens. It is easiest to punch out plates 1–12, build stacks of each type of component, and then build each one. Set aside parts not needed until later.

- 1) Lay base (A) down on your workspace in the orientation noted.
- 2) Next, place glue on the left end tab of inner wall (C) and connect to inner wall (B) and then place glue on the bottom of this structure and connect to base (Δ)
- 3) Next, place glue on the left end tab of inner wall (E) and connect to inner wall (D) and then place glue on the bottom of this structure and connect to base (A). Note that the rounded corners should face inward.
- 4) Next, place glue on the end tab of inner wall (B) and the bottom of outer wall (F) and connect.
- 5) Next, place glue on the end tab of inner wall (E), the bottom and end tabs of end wall (G), and connect.
- **6)** Next, place glue on the end tab of inner wall (**D**) and the bottom of outer wall (**H**) and connect.
- 7) Next, place glue on the end tabs and bottom of end wall (I) and connect.
- 8) Finally, after allowing 5 minutes to dry, place the tray lid on the tray.



Note: Gloomhaven 2nd edition minis have bases of varying sizes, unlike 1st edition, so we have provided two mini slots in each character tray. The smaller slot will work for 1st edition. Each character tray lid has cutouts to accomodate the larger second edition mini bases.

Building the Large Character Tray (1x)


This single larger tray is for the character that has two minis.

- 1) Lay base (J) down on your workspace in the orientation noted.
- 2) Next, place glue on the left end tab of inner wall (L) and connect to inner wall (K) and then place glue on the bottom of this structure and connect to base (J).
- 3) Next, place glue on the left end tab of inner wall (N) and connect to inner wall (M) and then place glue on the bottom of this structure and connect to base (J). Note that the high notch should touch the outer wall.
- 4) Next, place glue on the end tab of inner wall (K) and the bottom of outer wall (O) and connect.
- 5) Next, place glue on the end tab of inner wall (M), the bottom and end tabs of end wall (P), and connect.
- **6)** Next, place glue on the end tab of inner wall (**N**) and the bottom of outer wall (**Q**) and connect.
- 7) Next, place glue on the end tabs and bottom of end wall (R) and connect.
- 8) Finally, after allowing 5 minutes to dry, place the tray lid on the tray.


Building the Monster Stat Tray


This tray is used to store the monster stat sheets and envelopes. Pay attention to the orientation of the large walls; they only fit together one way. Dry fit before gluing!


- 1) Place base (S) down on your workspace in the orientation noted.
- 2) Next, apply glue to the bottom and side tabs of end wall (U) and connect to base (S).
- 3) Next, apply glue to the bottom of outer wall (W) and connect to base (S). The etching should face outward. Repeat on the other side for outer wall (V).
- 4) Finally, apply glue to the bottom and side tabs of end wall (U) and connect.





Building the Small Card Tray

The small card tray is used to store the small cards not associated with the characters.

- 1) Place base (A) down on your workspace in the orientation noted.
- 2) Next, place glue on the bottom of three rails (B) highlighted in brown and connect to base (A). Note that the rails need to be oriented properly. They only fit one way. Dry fit first!
- 3) Next, place glue on the left end tabs of the rails (B) you just connected and glue on the bottom of outer wall (C) and connect. Repeat on the other side.
- **4)** Finally, place glue on the bottom and end tabs of rail (B) and connect. Repeat on the other side. Note that the rails need to be oriented properly. They only fit one way. Dry fit first!
- 5) After your tray has had a few minutes to dry, place a few dividers in the tray to ensure a perfect fit.





Building the Large Card Tray


The large card tray is used to store the large cards not associated with the characters.


- 1) Place base (D) down on your workspace in the orientation noted.
- 2) Next, apply glue to the bottom and end tabs of end wall (F) and connect.
- 3) Next, apply glue on the bottom of outer wall (E) and connect.
- 4) Next, apply glue to the bottom and end tabs of end wall (F) and connect.
- 5) Finally, apply glue on the bottom of outer wall (E) and connect.
- 6) After your tray has had a few minutes to dry, place a few dividers in the tray to ensure a perfect fit.


Building the Stand Tray

This tray is utilized to store the standee bases.

- 1) Place base (G) down on your workspace in the orientation noted.
- 2) Next, apply glue to the bottom and end tabs of end wall (I) and connect.
- 3) Next, apply glue on the bottom of outer wall (H) and connect.
- 4) Next, apply glue to the bottom and end tabs of end wall (I) and connect.
- 5) Finally, apply glue on the bottom of outer wall (H) and connect.
- 6) After your tray has had a few minutes to dry, place the lid on it to ensure a perfect fit.








Building the Summon Token Tray

The summon token tray provides three compartments to store your summon tokens, tracker tokens, and 1st edition XP/HP wood trackers. If you have the second edition, you will have a spare compartment.

- 1) Place base (A) down on your workspace in the orientation noted to the right.
- 2) Next, place glue on the side tab of divider (C) and connect to inner wall (B).
- 3) Next, place glue on the bottom and end tabs of the structure (B, C) you completed in step #2 and connect to base (A).
- 4) Next, place glue on the bottom of outer wall (D) and connect. Repeat on the other side.
- 5) Finally, place glue on the bottom and end tabs of end wall (E) and connect. Repeat on the other side.
- 6) After a few minutes, place the lid on the tray to ensure a perfect fit.

Building the Token Tray


The token tray provides storage for general use tokens. Number tokens are called objective tokens in 2nd edition. Also, 2nd edition added scenario aid tokens.


- 1) Place base (G) down on your workspace in the orientation noted to the left.
- 2) Next, apply glue to the bottom and end tabs of the four (4) inner walls (H) and connect to base (G).
- 3) Next, apply glue on the bottom of outer wall (I) and connect. Repeat on the other side.
- **4)** Finally, apply glue to the bottom and end tabs of end wall (**J**) and connect. Repeat on the other side.
- 5) After a few minutes, place the lid on the tray to ensure a perfect fit.


Building the Status Token Tray

The status token tray provides storage for your status tokens, including regenerate tokens from Forgotton Circles.

- 1) Place base (K) down on your workspace in the orientation noted to the right.
- 2) Next, apply glue to the bottom and end tabs of the two (2) tall inner walls (L) and connect to base (K).
- 3) Next, apply glue to the bottom and end tabs of divider (\mathbf{M}) and connect in the orientation shown.
- **4)** Next, apply glue to the bottom and end tabs of end wall (**0**) and connect. Repeat on the other side.
- 5) Next, apply glue to the bottom of outer wall (P) and connect in the orientation POISON shown.
- **6)** Next, apply glue to the bottom outer wall (N) and connect in the orientation shown.
- 7) Next, apply glue to the side tabs of the three (3) inner dividers (Z) and connect.
- 8) After a few minutes, place the lid on the tray to ensure a perfect fit.







Building the Monster Compendium #1 Tray

This tray holds monster standees. Note the etched text for orientation purposes when building.

- 1) Place base (A) down on your workspace in the orientation noted.
- 2) Next, place glue on the bottom of horizontal inner walls (D, E, F) and connect to base (A).
- 3) Next, place glue on the right end tab and connect outer wall (B) to wall (C).
- 4) Next, place glue on the bottom of vertical dividers (Gx2, H, I) and connect to base (A).
- **5)** Next, place glue to the bottom inner side of the (**B**, **C**) wall structure you built in #3 and connect to base (**A**). **Hint:** the outer wall (**B**) will seat against the vertical dividers (**G**).
- **6)** Next, place glue on the upper side tabs of dividers (**C**, **G**x2, **I**) and the bottom of outer wall (**J**) and connect.
- 7) Next, place glue on the end tabs of dividers (D, E, F) and on the bottom and end tabs of outer wall (M) and connect.
- 8) Next, place glue on the end tabs of dividers (H, I) and on the bottom and end tabs of outer wall (L) and connect.
- 9) Finally, place glue on the bottom and end tabs of outer wall (K) and connect.
- **10)** After your tray has had a few minutes to dry, place the lid on it.







This tray holds monster standees too.





- 2) Next, apply glue to the bottom of horizontal walls (O, P) and connect. Note etching orientation and that wall (P) is both an inner wall and an outer wall.
- 3) Next, apply glue on the left end tab of horizontal inner wall (Q) and connect to outer wall (R). Note etching orientation.
- 4) Next, apply glue to the inner bottom area of the structure you built in #3 and connect to base (A). Note etching orientation.
- 5) Next, apply glue to the bottom and end tab of both dividers (S) and connect.
- **6)** Next, apply glue to the bottom and end tabs of both dividers (T) and connect.
- 7) Next, apply glue to the bottom and end tabs of dividers (U, V, W) and connect.
- **8)** Next, apply glue to the bottom and end tabs of the three dividers (**X**) and connect.
- 9) Next, apply glue to the end tabs of dividers (Tx2, U, V, W) and the bottom of outer wall (Y) and connect.
- 10) Next, apply glue to the end tabs of dividers (X*3) and the bottom and end tabs of outer wall (AA) and connect.
- 11) Next, apply glue to the end tabs of dividers (O, P, Q) and the end tabs and bottom of outer wall (Z) and connect.

 12) Finally, apply glue to the end tabs and bottom of outer wall (AB)
- and connect.
- 13) After your tray has had a few minutes to dry, place the lid on it.










Building the Long Terrain Tray

This terrain tray provides storage for terrain components. Note the position of engraved text when building.

- 1) Place base (A) down on your workspace in the orientation noted to the right.
- 2) Next, place glue on the bottom of five (5) dividers (B) and the single short divider (H) and connect to base (A) as highlighted in brown in the image.
- 3) Next, place glue on the bottom of inner walls (C, D, G) and connect. Note the etched text and place accordingly.
- **4)** Next, place glue on both sets of side tabs of the six dividers (**B**) and the bottom of outer wall (**E**) and connect. Note the etched text position. Repeat on the other side with outer wall (**F**).
- 5) Finally, place glue on the end tabs of inner walls (C, D) and the bottom and end tabs of end wall (B) and connect. Repeat on the other side with end wall (J).




Building the Medium Terrain Tray


This terrain tray provides storage for terrain components and bosses. Note the position of engravings.

- 1) Place base (K) down on your workspace in the orientation noted to the left.
- 2) Next, place glue on the bottom and side tabs of four (4) inner walls (L, L, L, M) and connect to base (K) as highlighted in brown in the image.
- 3) Next, place glue on the bottom and side tabs of the two (2) dividers (**O**, **N**) and connect to base (**K**) as highlighted in purple in the image. Note the etched text and place
 - **4**) Next, place glue on the bottom of long outer wall (**Q**) and connect. Note the etched text and place accordingly.
 - 5) Next, place glue on the bottom of long outer wall (P) and connect.
 - **6**) Next, apply glue to the bottom and side tabs of end wall (L) and connect.
 - 7) Finally, apply glue to the bottom and side tabs of end wall (R) and connect.


The tile keys provided in this kit are used to lift tiles from the storage trays, if needed. They are intended to be stored on top of monsters and terrain when not in use.



Storing Your Trays in the Box



Step One: Place 17 character trays (**A**) in the box as illustrated with the taller one on the left (the low-profile character box is not placed yet). Then place the small card tray (**B**) and the monster stat tray (**C**).



Step Two: Next, place the long terrain tray (**A**), large card tray (**B**), token tray (**C**), summon tray (**D**), standees tray (**E**), and the monster compendium #1 tray (**F**) in the



Step Three: Next, place the medium terrain tray (A), low-profile character tray (B), and the monster compendium #2 tray (C) in the box.



Step Four: Next, place the Forgotten Circles monster tray (**A**) and the status tokens tray (**B**) in the box.

Step Five: Finally, place your GH-002 top tray on top of the trays if you have one. If not, carefully store the tiles and other larger items on top of your trays and close the box
