Construction Tips

- 1) Each piece should be removed from the frames with gentle pressure back and forth. You should not need a knife to cut pieces free.
- 2) Our inserts are designed to be glued together. We use Sobo craft glue, but any glue that is tacky and dries clear will work fine. Tacky glue assists with building as it holds better during construction. You can use painter's/masking tape for some joins, but glue is always best.
- 3) Ensure you cleanup excess glue as you build. This is especially important in card lanes where dividers will be used or in spaces where a tray will be stored.
- 4) Check the build diagrams included in the package for reference, including all parts, as well as build tips specific to this insert.
- 5) Always dry fit pieces first to ensure a good fit and to better understand how the kit goes together.
- 6) Allow your finished insert to dry overnight.
- 7) You can optionally sand and even stain your insert.


Building the Large Card Trays (2)


These two trays are designed to store the card sets provided in the game. Each tray has an etching on the ouside front wall. If you don't sleeve, you will have some spare room in each tray. If you sleeve, your card trays will be filled.

- 1) Lay base (A) down on your workspace.
- 2) Next, apply glue to the bottom of end wall (D) and connect to base (A).
- 3) Next, apply glue to the bottom and both side tabs of side wall (B) and connect. Repeat on the other side.
- 4) Finally, apply glue to the bottom of end wall (C) and connect. **Note:** the etching should face outward.
- 5) Repeat step 1-4 to build the second tray.

Finally, after allowing the trays to dry for several minutes, you should place a few dividers in the tray to ensure a perfect fit.

Note: the card trays and dividers are designed to store the card sets using the card reference number and alphabetically. Each divider has a reference ID and number of cards in the set – SD (73). The divider etchings alternate left and right to allow you to easily see the etchings and remove the card sets.





Building the Small Card Tray


This tray is used to store the (SD) cards and the Board cards.


- 1) Lay base (F) down on your workspace.
- 2) Next, apply glue to the bottom of end wall (G) and connect to base (F).
- 3) Next, apply glue to the bottom and both side tabs of outer wall (H) and connect. Repeat on the other side with outer wall
- 4) Finally, apply glue to the bottom of end wall (J) and connect. **Note:** the etching should face outward.


Finally, after allowing the trays to dry for several minutes, you should place a few dividers in the tray to ensure a perfect fit.






Building the Player Tray

The player tray is designed to store the player components.

- 1) Lay base (A) down on your workspace.
- 2) Next, apply glue to the bottom of the 4x divider walls (B) and connect to base (A).
- **3)** Next, apply glue to the bottom and both side tabs of end wall (**D**) and connect. Repeat on the other side. Note: the second end wall (**D**) is located on plate #3.
- 4) Finally, apply glue to the bottom of side wall (C) and connect to base (A). Repeat on the other side.

Finally, after allowing the tray to dry for several minutes, you should place the lid (**Z**) on the tray to ensure a perfect fit and allow the glue to finish drying.





Building the Token Trays (2)

These two token trays are used to store all of your wooden tokens. The trays feature adjustable dividers so that you can design your perfect component layout within the trays.

- 1) Lay base (F) down on your workspace.
- 2) Next, apply glue to the bottom of the divider wall (G) and connect to base (A).
- **3)** Next, apply glue to the bottom of end wall (**H**) and connect. Repeat on the other side.
- **4)** Finally, apply glue to the bottom and side tabs of side wall (J) and connect to base (A). Repeat on the other side.
- 5) Repeat step 1-4 to construct the second tray.


Once your trays have had a few minutes to dry, place a couple of the dividers (X) on each side to ensure a perfect fit. Note that each divider has a short and long tab side. Long tab side should always be used on the outer walls.

Once you have decided on your token layout, feel free to glue the dividers (X) into the tray.

Storing Your Trays in the Box

Step One:

Place the long card trays (A), small card tray (B), and player component tray (C) in the bottom of the box.



Step Two:

Next, place the two token trays (**D**) into the box on top of the other trays. The long card tray lift handles are slightly taller than the card trays and these two token trays rest on those lift handles.



Step Three:

Finally, place the game board, game manuals, and reference cards on top of the trays and close the box.

This solution contributes zero lid lift.
